Accommodations

Lodging and classrooms will be at the [Istituto San Lodovico](#). You will share a room with one or two others and can list roommate preferences on the registration form.

Fees and Expenses

Trip Deposit: \$375

Estimated Travel Costs-

Airfare: \$1800

Lodging: \$650 (13 nights, includes breakfasts)

Meal plan: \$250 (10 lunches & 10 dinners)

Rail tickets: \$40 (Round trip from Rome to Orvieto. These are purchased upon arriving in Rome)

Suggested amount for personal expenses/souvenirs: \$500

Class Fees-

Course tuition¹: \$2800 (\$350/unit x 8 units for both courses). Payable to Registrar's Office at time of registration).

Fuller student auditing fee (if applicable): \$25

Alumni/Fuller student spouse fee: \$300

Group members will be responsible for registering for the courses, making their own airline reservations and purchasing rail tickets to Orvieto. The Brehm Center will make arrangements for lodging, meals, ground transportation, and museum entrance fees in Orvieto, Siena, and Assisi. There will be a welcome reception on the evening of June 17. The meal plan includes all lunches and dinners except for the first night and the two field trip days. The last meal provided in the lodging and meal fees will be breakfast at San Lodovico the morning of June 30.

Course Summaries

Dr. Dyrness and Dr. Peace will inter-twine the two following courses, making it a single program. Consequently, everyone who goes on the trip will be required to take for both courses. If you only want to take one of the courses, you will need to register as an auditor for the second one.

TC 519: Topics in Theology and the Visual Arts: Medieval Art and Theology (Dr. William Dyrness).

This course studies selected texts and artistic programs from the late medieval period, 1300–1500. Offered in Orvieto, Italy, it will feature in-depth study of Giotto’s “Life of St Francis” in the Upper Church of San Francesco in Assisi, Ambrogio Lorenzetti’s “Good Government and Bad Government” in the Palazzo Pubblico of Siena, and Signorelli’s fresco program in the Capella Nuova in Orvieto in the context of the theological and worship life of the late middle ages and early renaissance. Chris Slatoff will lecture on the sculpture program of Lorenzo Maitani and lead the studio portion. Dyrness, Slatoff

SP 500: Medieval and Catholic Reformation Spirituality (Dr. Richard Peace).

This course focuses on the spiritual understanding and practices of six key figures drawn from the Medieval and Catholic Reformation era. Their stories will be set in the context of the medieval understanding of liturgy and spirituality. In particular, the tension between church-based spirituality (the Eucharist) and experiential spirituality (mystical experience) will be examined. These six figures are Hildegard of Bingen, Francis of Assisi, Clare of Assisi, Catherine of Siena, Ignatius of Loyola, and Teresa of Ávila. Judy Peace will serve as guest lecturer on the women mystics. Offered in Orvieto, Italy the course will include trips to Assisi and Siena as well as exploration of the town of Orvieto, in particular its cathedral. Richard and Judy Peace

Dr. Dyrness' course fills elective slots and also can be used as an emphasis course for the WTA and TA emphases. Dr. Peace's course fulfills the Spiritual Traditions and Practices requirement.
